PARSONAGE UPDATE

During the last two months several things have been done to update the parsonage.

The most exciting is the installation of a security system. It was financed by the parsonage fund, by generous donations from individuals, and by the Building/Maintenance (Trustee Account).

There had been a growing concern about parsonage safety due to the increased foot and automobile traffic in the area.

The Trustees have removed the dog log fencing and have made some minor repairs to the back deck. A railing has been installed leading from the back parking area to the deck. They have also done some tree pruning in the back yard.

The basement area has been cleaned out and the old items were sold at the recent church yard sale. Proceeds from that sale were added to the funds for installing the security system.

A policy resolution concerning major changes in parsonage furnishings was approved at the Annual Conference in June. The new policy will go into effect at our next change of ministers. (The intent of the new policy is to allow the parsonage family to have their own furniture.) The policy states that the church's obligation is to furnish only a formal living room and dining room and a fourth bedroom if there is one. The committee will work with the outgoing and incoming ministers to make this transition as smooth as possible.

The Committee is grateful to the Trustees for their efforts in providing our minister with a well maintained home.

It's unbelievable how quickly this month has gone by! Halloween is here, Thanksgiving is just around the corner, and Christmas will be here before we know it! We've been really busy here at the Weekday School preparing for all those events!

October was a great month! The weather (for the most part) has been beautiful so the children have really enjoyed being able to spend more time outdoors. (As for us "older folks", it sure would be nice to see some more rain!) We've had lots of fun activities going on, among them the Firefighters' Safety Program on the 5th. The boys and girls learned all about what to do in case of fire. They loved the firefighters' new interactive robot, "Sparky, the Fire Dog"! "Sparky" rode around in a little fire truck while he talked and sang to the children about fire safety. (He could even carry on conversations with them!) After the "Sparky" show, the boys and girls enjoyed seeing a real fire truck "up close" and watched one of the firefighters as he dressed in his full fire-fighting gear. MISSION TRIP TO GANADO, ARIZONA NAVAJO INDIAN RESERVATION

- Who?** Anyone that is interested in being of service to some of God's children that need our help. No talents needed. All ages can apply.
- When?** July 3—July 15, 2008. Leaving from Pine Grove United Methodist Church.
- Where?** Ganado, Arizona. Also visits will be made to Canyon de Chelly, Window Rock, Hubbell Trading Post, Fluted Rock, Monument Valley, Durango and a train ride to Silverton, Colorado.
- How?** Travel by Holiday Tour coach with overnight stops in Tennessee, Oklahoma, and New Mexico and six nights on the reservation at the Sage Memorial Hospital Complex.
- Why?** To teach a Vacation Bible School to the Navajo children and work projects with the Hospital, Presbyterian, and the Methodist churches.
- Costs?** From \$889.00 (4 to a room) to \$1,019.00 (2 to a room). Includes lodging, food, and entrance fees. It does not include six dinner meals at stops at the motels while traveling.
