The last Leadership Team Meeting was held on April 30, 2023. Rickie Shutt opened the meeting with prayer and then proceeded with the following agenda items:

- **I. Budget Line Items:** Currently, revenue is not keeping up with expenses. The team decided that by July 2023 they need to come up with a new budget that reflects our current status of donations and expenses and remove some of the budget line items that are no longer pertinent to the operations of the church. Pastor Sandra will continue to look at ways to cut expenses which means getting quotes for items like insurance, etc.
- **II. Repair Decisions for the following:** Replace broken smoke detector in hallway; repair exit signs in hallway; replace any burned out bulbs in the building; repair door to entrance of Fellowship Hall; trim trees at handicap ramp. Rickie, Susette, and Rhita Newcomb agreed to address the above items.
- III. Write a new Church Policy/Covenant and/or Statement of Faith regarding same sex weddings and practicing homosexual clergy: Originally the team had decided to nominate 3 team members to pursue this assignment but then Pastor Sandra and Debbie were able to find statements from other churches as well as from the 2016 book of Discipline that will be used as resources and were able to write a submission for the team to vote on at the next meeting and then send to the district. More information is to come regarding this item.
- **IV. Renewal of Lease for the parsonage:** The team voted to renew the lease to continue to rent the parsonage to Peggy Williams for another year.
- V. Miscellaneous Business: 1) The team voted to find a realtor to look at and give an estimate on the value of the Sara Lane property before making a final vote to proceed with getting approval from the District to put the property up for sale. More information to come. 2) Rhita Newcomb will be contacting the Red Cross about giving CPR and Defib training to volunteers in keeping in step with our Safe Sanctuary plan. 3) Polly Caudle announced that she would be stepping down as the Rise Against Hunger Campaign chair and has asked for someone to take her place for 2023. 4) Pastor Sandra asked the team if the church would sponsor a Vacation Bible School this summer and the team agreed. 5) The team voted to write and send checks to any ministry that had yet to receive it's designated fund balance for the 2022-23 year.
- VI. The next Leadership Team meeting will be held on July 16th following the worship service.

Rhita and I just got back from the Spiritual Enrichment Retreat at Lake Junaluska. It was a such a mountain top experience. The Reverend Jan Brittain delivered a message about women coming Women to Jesus. She gave new perspective to the stories of Mary and Martha, and most of us came away having more respect for both of these women who were among the friends of Jesus.

We had a busy quarter. We made \$500 on our pastry sale; we collected supplies to make ten sanitary kits for UMCOR; and we hosted the Wear a Hat, Bring a Hat tea to support the local Cancer Services. We sewed all year and packed up 75 sustainable sanitary kits to go to Costa Rica. These kits are washable, reusable, and last about 3 years. This is a continuing project, and we usually meet on the first Wednesday of the month on the second floor in the sewing room. Contact Jean if you would like to join us.
